

Environmental Impacts

Victoria is home to unique and stunning flora, fauna and landscapes. In protecting these natural values, Victorians can be proud of the state's protective and strong environmental regulations.

Fera intends to go above and beyond these regulations to protect and **benefit** the local environment.

Each project requires a 2-year **comprehensive flora and fauna survey** to inform the project's design.

Particular attention will be paid to threatened or endangered local species, from the Striped Legless Lizard to the Golden Sun Moth.

Once all ecological information is gathered, project plans will be adjusted to ensure environmental impacts are minimized.

The protection of these species is paramount.

Fera is committed to its projects benefiting local environments.

Throughout the lifespan of its Victorian projects, Fera will contribute \$500,000 a year to regional community funds operated entirely by local communities.

Fera is in discussions with local Landcare groups, seeking to use a large portion of this money to rehabilitate local land and habitats.
